

<u>UTAH LEGISLATURE BEGINS:</u> The 2014 Utah Legislative session opened today. This is a great time to get involved in Catholic advocacy! This session will present issues regarding **care of creation** as air and water quality bills are debated, **human life and dignity issues** around human trafficking, suicide, and preventing fatal drug overdoses, and **option for the poor and vulnerable** as we advocate for criminal justice reform, fair housing practices, living wages, and health care.

What can you do? Come to the Capitol! Anyone interested in advocating from the Catholic position, please contact me and we can set up a date and time for you to join in Diocesan advocacy efforts. You can also contact your legislator via email and let them know where you stand on the issues. <u>HUMAN TRAFFICKING:</u> While the legislature will consider two bills related to human trafficking, activities around the Super Bowl have far too often included increased sex trafficking in the state where the game is held. While human trafficking is a major issue across the United States year-round, this event brings it to the forefront. It also poses an opportunity to catch the traffickers and rescue the victims.

What can you do? Join a petition to the local law enforcement agencies of the towns surrounding the stadium to be aware and respond appropriately to this issue. The goal is to get 5,000 signatures in five days. <u>Click here</u> to add your name to the petition.
